

STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Trinity - God is both One and Triune. The Biblical revelation testifies that there is only one God and that He is eternally existent in three persons—Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

God the Father - God the Father is the creator and sustainer of all things, and He created the universe in love. He created man in His own image for fellowship and called man back to Himself through Christ after the rebellion and fall of man.

The Son - Jesus Christ is eternally God. He was together with the Father and the Holy Spirit from the beginning, and through Him all things were made. For man's redemption, He left heaven and became incarnate by the Holy Spirit through the virgin Mary; henceforth, He is forever one Christ with two natures—God and man—in one person.

The Holy Spirit - The Holy Spirit is God, the Lord and giver of life, who was active in the Old Testament and given to the Church in fullness at Pentecost. He empowers the saints for service and witness, cleanses man from the old nature and conforms us to the image of Christ. The baptism in the Holy Spirit, subsequent to conversion, releases the fullness of the Spirit and is evidenced by the fruits and gifts of the Holy Spirit.

The Scriptures - We believe that the Bible (both Old and New Testaments) is the inspired, infallible Word of God and that its authority is ultimate, final and eternal. It cannot be added to, subtracted from or superseded in any regard. The Bible is the source of all doctrine, instruction, correction and reproof. It contains all that is needed for guidance in godliness and practical Christian conduct.

The Atonement - Christ's death on the cross paid the penalty for the sins of the whole world, but its benefits are only applicable to those who believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior. Healing—body, soul and spirit—and all of God's provisions for His saints, are provided for in the atonement, but these must be appropriated.

Salvation - Salvation is a free gift of God, based on the merits of the death of His Son, and is appropriated by faith. Salvation is affected by personal repentance, belief in the Lord Jesus (justification) and personal acceptance of Him into one's life as Lord and Savior (regeneration). The new life in Christ includes the privileges of adoption and inheritance in the kingdom of God's beloved Son. Salvation is an act of free will in response to God's personal love for mankind and should produce an active lifestyle of loving obedience and service to Jesus Christ our Savior.

The Christian Life - We believe that God's divine power has given us everything that we need to live a life of Godliness and that through daily surrender to the Holy Spirit we will be transformed into the image of Jesus Christ.

Marriage – We believe that the term "marriage" has only one meaning: the uniting of one man and one woman in a single, exclusive union, as delineated in Scripture. We believe that God intends sexual intimacy to occur only between a man and a woman who are married to each other. We will only recognize marriages between a biological man and a biological woman.

Human Life – We believe that all human life is sacred and created by God in His image. Human life is of inestimable worth in all its dimensions, including pre-born babies, the aged, the physically or mentally challenged, and every other stage or condition from conception through natural death. We are therefore called to defend, protect, and value all human life.

The Church - The role of the Church is to encourage the saints, equip them for the works of the ministry, and to release them to minister to those inside and outside of the Church. A healthy church is one that operates under biblical authority. SomaChurch is Elder Governed, Pastor Led, Staff Ran and Church owned. It is essential to the life of the Church that scriptural patterns of discipline are practiced and that oversight for Church discipline, individual and corporate, is exercised by the leadership of the Church.

Baptism and the Lord's Supper - The Word of God places on the church two perpetual ordinances of the Lord Jesus Christ. The first, baptism, is the outward sign of what God has already done in the individual's life and is a testimony to all that the person now belongs to Jesus. It is identification with Jesus and is affected in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The Lord's Supper is a commemoration of the death of the Lord and is done in remembrance of Him until He comes again; it is a sign of our loving participation in Him. Both institutions are restricted to those who are believers.

Eschatology - We affirm the bodily, personal, second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ, the resurrection of the saints, the millennium and the final judgment. The final judgment will determine the eternal status of both the saints and the unbelievers, determined by their relationship to Jesus Christ.

CHURCH GOVERNMENT

The church is the hope of the world, because it brings the truth of God to bear on the needs of society and individuals as it reaches out in ministry. In order for the church to have its most powerful impact, it must have a working structure of government. No church will grow larger in terms of the number of its members or the scope of its ministry than its government will allow. No church will achieve its full impact of ministry without an effective structure of organization and government. When a church chooses its government, it molds, shapes and casts its destiny.

Church government is the channel from which **vision flows** for the work of God's kingdom. The church is the manifold expression of its members, and **destiny forms** for the individuals serving in His work through effective and efficient structure for governance and ministry. There are promised results for those relating to the church in a healthy way.

1. A place to find Love, Acceptance and Forgiveness


Galatians 2:6–10 But from those who seemed to be something–whatever they were, it makes no difference to me; God shows personal favoritism to no man—for those who seemed to be something added nothing to me. But on the contrary, when they saw that the gospel for the uncircumcised had been committed to me, as the gospel for the circumcised was to Peter (for He who worked effectively in Peter for the apostleship to the circumcised also worked effectively in me toward the Gentiles), and when James, Cephas, and John, who seemed to be pillars, perceived the grace that had been given to me, they gave me and **Barnabas the right hand of fellowship**, that we should go to the Gentiles and they to the circumcised. They desired only that we should remember the poor, the very thing which I also was eager to do.

A place to be Planted, Fruitful and Flourishing

<u>Psalm 92:13–15</u> Those who are planted in the house of the Lord shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall still bear fruit in old age; they shall be fresh and flourishing, to declare that the Lord is upright; He is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in Him.

3. A place of Service, Ministry and Connection

2 Corinthians 8:1–7 Moreover, brethren, we make known to you the grace of God bestowed on the churches of Macedonia: that in a great trial of affliction the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded in the riches of their liberality. For I bear witness that according to their ability, yes, and beyond their ability, they were freely willing, imploring us with much urgency that we would receive **the gift and the fellowship** of the ministering to the saints. And not only as we had hoped, but they first gave themselves to the Lord, and then to us by the will of God. So we urged Titus, that as he had begun, so he would also complete this grace in you as well. But as you abound in everything-in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all diligence, and in your love for us—see that you abound in this grace also.



THE ROLE OF WOMEN IN MINISTRY

Introduction

SomaChurch strongly believes in recognizing and supporting the contribution of women in the ministry of the church. We believe in the value of women in all aspects of ministry with the exception of those areas that exercise governmental authority within the church. Furthermore, we believe God has ordained the family unit to serve as a model for the entire church with the father as the head of the home and functioning as a servant-leader as described in Ephesians 5. We therefore believe that both men and women can reach their fullest potential in ministry within the structure of the biblical family model. We believe a woman can teach and lead within any of the vast array of ministry roles and positions as long as she demonstrates a biblically-qualifying lifestyle. She must also submit herself, along with other servant-leaders, to those leaders God has placed in positions of governing authority, specifically, the Lead Pastor or the Elders of the church. We believe that the positions of Lead Pastor and Elder are (because of their governmental responsibility) reserved only for men. With the exception of these two positions, we consider all ministry positions and opportunities to be open to women.

Equality of Men and Women

The Bible clearly reveals that God is not a respecter of persons (Romans 2:11; Acts 10:34; Ephesians 6:9). At SomaChurch, we ascribe to a belief in the equality of all men and women. On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit filled both men and women alike without concern for gender (Acts 2:1–21). Both women and men are called to faithful service and good stewardship of all that God provides. We discover throughout the New Testament that both genders participated in a full variety of Christian service including prophecy, leadership and teaching (Acts 2:15–18; Acts 18:26; Acts 21:9; Romans 16:7; 1 Corinthians 11:5).

The Work of the Holy Spirit

One of the most quoted prophetic declarations is found in the book of Joel where the prophet writes that God will pour out His spirit "upon all flesh; and ... your daughters shall prophesy ... and upon the handmaids in those days will I pour out my Spirit" (Joel 2:28–29; see also Acts 2:17). Ministry in the New Testament is defined within Spirit-empowered expressions of God's wonderful gifts. Nowhere in the writings of the New Testament do we find conditions or exceptions placed on the distribution of spiritual gifts along gender lines. Thus, while some gifts are a spontaneous work of the Holy Spirit and others are recognized ministry gifts to the Church, all gifts are given by God for His greater purpose and without regard to social, economic or gender demarcation (Romans 12:6–8; 1 Corinthians 12:7–11, 27–28; Ephesians 4:7–12; 1 Peter 4:10–11). We conclude, therefore, that women can serve in vital roles in ministry and this position is further illustrated in the apostle Paul's many references to women serving with him in ministry throughout the church.

Controversial Texts Concerning Women in Ministry

There are two often-quoted passages within the Pauline writings that have caused heated debate over many generations on the topic of women in ministry.

1 Corinthians 14:34-35

In the first passage Paul writes to the church at Corinth, "Let your women keep silent in the churches: for it is not permitted unto them to speak ..." (1 Corinthians 14:34–35, KJV). Unfortunately, this passage has mistakenly been cited to justify a position that rejects the biblical role of women in ministry. Actually, when understood within the context of Paul's complete letter to a very troubled church, we gain a more informed perspective. Given that earlier in his letter Paul gave instructions regarding how women should

pray and prophesy in public (1 Corinthians 11:5), it can be assumed that Paul must have meant something other than absolute prohibition for women in the public arena of ministry. Such an interpretation would simply fail to coincide with countless other Pauline writings that affirm the ministry contribution made by women. Therefore, we conclude that within the context of the situation at Corinth that prompted the letter to be written originally, Paul's admonition here is in reference to excessive disruptions and disorder taking place. Therefore this passage, like the rest of the chapter, is an attempt to bring correction to the chaos and to affirm that "all things be done decently and in order" (1 Corinthians 14:40).

1 Timothy 2:11-15

Another challenging passage centers on Paul's instructions to his young apprentice, Timothy, when he writes, "I do not permit a woman to teach or to have authority over a man ..." (1 Timothy 2:12). This passage has troubled biblical scholars and church leaders for centuries. Was Paul offering some kind of transcultural mandate, or was he instead seeking to provide Timothy with spiritual counsel concerning the improper conduct occurring among some women in Ephesus (1 Timothy 2:9; 1 Timothy 5:13; 2 Timothy 3:6)? A review of the entire text of Paul's letter gives a strong indication that he was offering advice to Timothy on how to confront the heretical teaching and misconduct occurring among a number of women within the church. To view this passage in any other context would require denying the legitimacy of Paul's other references to the work and ministry of women within the various churches of his day. Such a perceived contradiction is inconsistent with the proven principles of biblical interpretation.

Biblical Examples of Women in Ministry

While the debate over the role of women in church ministry predominantly centers around the interpretation of two challenging New Testament passages (1 Corinthians 14:34 and 1 Timothy 2:12), a fair and thorough review of biblical records reveals explicit and overwhelming evidence to support Soma's stated position affirming the role of women in ministry. In the Old Testament, for instance, Miriam was used of God as a prophet during the time of the great exodus (Exodus 15:20). As both a prophet and a judge, Deborah was an instrumental leader in guiding God's army (Judges 4-5). And Huldah, another prophet, was a vital contributor to the powerful religious reform under King Josiah (2 Kings 22; 2 Chronicles 34). The New Testament also reveals the essential role women shared in the ministry of the early church. Contrary to the cultural norm of that time regarding the status of women in society, the apostle Paul frequently refers to the contribution made by women. For instance, Paul speaks of women who "worked hard with him" in the work of the gospel (Romans 16:6, 12; Philippians 4:3). At Philippi, Euodias and Syntyche were described as "fellow-workers" alongside Paul. This description is the same wording used to also describe other young ministers who served with Paul such as Timothy, Epaphroditus, Titus and Luke. Furthermore, as a servant (diakonos) at the church in Cenchrea (Romans 16:1–2), Phoebe was obviously viewed as more than simply a helper. In fact, Paul uses the same word (diakonos) to refer to other ministers and leaders in a congregation, including himself. From these and many other writings, we discover that Paul was an advocate of women in ministry. And contrary to the social order of the day, he frequently recognized the Spirit-inspired work that many women shared as fellow-laborers. We can conclude, therefore, that Scriptural evidence affirms the call of women to spiritual leadership and vital ministry roles in the early church. Such divine acknowledgement provides us with the irrefutable evidence we need to believe that God continues to call women to serve alongside men in the vital work of ministry today.

Conclusion

We believe that this equality of men and women represents the heart of God and the revelation of Scripture. While recognizing that certain governmental roles in the church do have some gender distinctiveness within the community of faith as it is true within the biblical construct of the home, we do affirm the tremendous contribution women have made in the early days of the church and must continue to make as we move forward in the ministry of SomaChurch. The Spirit of God is being poured out on all flesh and we seek to walk in step with the Holy Spirit in power and practice until Christ returns.

The **Abrahamic** Covenant was like God pushing "go" on His plan of redemption.

Genesis 12:1 Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go forth from your country, And from your relatives And from your father's house, the land which I will show you; And I will make you a great nation, And I will bless you, And make your name great; And so you shall be a blessing; And I will bless those who bless you, And the one who curses you I will curse.

And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed."

Messianic Prophecy – Old Testament Scriptures that foretell the person and work of Christ.

Covenant means "A coming Together"

English – "Let's make a covenant." **Hebrew** – "Let's 'cut' a covenant."

Cut The Covenant. Walk the pieces.

Why it matters

Why it matters

We believe that everyone who has been born again of the Spirit has been given at least one "spiritual" gift. Much like all parts of a body works together as a unit, so spiritual gifts are given uniquely to individuals who are a part of the "body" of Christ for the purpose of working together as one. Spiritual gifts are not to be used for personal gain but rather to spread the gospel message and to encourage and equip the saints for effective service. **Romans 12**, **Ephesians 4**, 1 **Corinthians 12**

Taking a Spiritual Gifts test can be difficult because many of the questions are based upon wonderful characteristics and deeds, all of which you would love to possess. The best way to take a spiritual gifts test is to be honest about who you are and your natural inclinations (or lack thereof) toward the specified question. Remember that you have been given gifts by the Holy Spirit and He makes no mistakes!

WHY WE SERVE

Jesus said, "The Son of man came not to be served but to serve..." (Matt. 20:28), and He calls us to do the same. As Christians, our vitality is shown by our desire to serve one another. Pulse Teams are our various teams and areas of engagement where you can get plugged in and begin serving the Body. Volunteering in one of Soma's Pulse Teams is a great way to serve the Body of Christ and build relationships with those you serve with.

Soma has always enjoyed an "Everyone working together as one!" style of ministry. You may recall from our Church Government section that we are "staff" ran and "church owned." Because we all own the "discipleship" here at Soma, our staff and volunteers work hand in hand to provide consistent and effective ministry. The selfless gifts of your time, talent and giftings are what make SomaChurch a safe place for people to grow in their faith!

We also believe in Sabbath and work hard to promote and a cultural of rest. "Everyone working together as one" only works when no one feels worn out! We understand that overextending your already busy schedule would hinder your personal spiritual growth and negatively impact ministry for Soma. This is why our Staff works carefully in scheduling volunteers as you prayerfully consider areas of ministry that match your time, talents and giftings with our needs. You might love the opportunity to join the Worship team but then learn that our Kid's ministry could use a few extra volunteers. Or perhaps you love serving in Youth, but we could use the help on our Hospitality team. Please be prayerful in where God would have you serve.

Speaking of no one feeling worn out! **SomaChurch is a family with a lot of kids.** At any given service, roughly 1/3 of people on campus are 10 years old and younger. This, of course, is a blessing, but also requires us to be strategic! **We have found that when parents from every family with children in SomaKids (babies through 4th grade) commits to serve on rotation, everyone feels rested and able to consistently enjoy all other aspects of community and spiritual growth at Soma.** What does this mean practically? Once you have turned in your SomaKids Team Application and your Background Check clears, one of our Kids Directors will contact you about how and when to best serve on our 4-6-week rotation. Many people hate to miss a service and have chosen to SERVE ONE and ATTEND ONE. This is not required or expected but has proven to be a positive way to "work together as one" and own the discipleship of our kids at SomaChurch.

PULSE TEAMS

Jesus said, "The Son of Man came not to be served but to serve..." (Matt. 20:28), and He calls us to do the same. As Christians, our vitality is shown by our willingness to serve one another. Volunteering in one of Soma's Pulse Teams is one way to serve the Body of Christ in the context of the local church. You can find a list and description of all of our current Pulse Teams below. As discussed in our Membership Covenant, we ask each Covenant Member to serve on one of the SomaChurch Pulse Teams.

ServicePrep Preparation communicates to people that you care. Our Service Prep Team works hard to have our facility ready to worship God and experience life giving community every weekend.

SomaHospitality Community begins with connecting. Our Hospitality Team plays a vital part of helping people feel loved and accepted by our church family. (Includes Hosts, Greeters & Ushers)

SomaWorship & Production Our Worship Teams work together to provide exciting atmospheres where people can have genuine encounters with God that produce lifechanging results. You can also join our Production Team (Sound and/or Media (A/V)). This crew works behind the scenes to make sure production elements of the Weekend Services run with excellence.

SomaKids Every kid is special and has been called by God to accomplish great things for His Kingdom. It is our privilege to partner with parents to raise up young passionate disciples of Jesus. We have three different age ranges to serve – Littles (Babies to PreK), K-1 & 2nd-4th).

FSM (Fifth/Sixth Grade Ministry) Leaders in FSM have the privilege of pouring into the next generation of influencers and disciples of Jesus Christ through weekly gatherings centered on teaching the Bible and living out healthy community.

SomaYouth We believe that God will use this generation of students in a way that surpasses every other generation in history so we are committed to giving them everything we've got!

SomaWatch Church should always be a safe place. Our Security Team gives their attention to protecting the property from anything that would threaten danger to our congregation.

Group Leaders Life is best lived alongside others. Every Leader is passionate about connecting people and helping them grow in their walks with God. Group leaders lead Soma's Connect, Grow and Care Groups.
